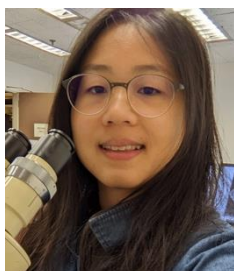
CELEBRATING INTERNATIONAL DAY OF WOMEN & GIRLS IN SCIENCE
